Resident Spotlight - Larry Larson

Larry Arthur Larson was born on December 20, 1938, as the third child in his family. He attended Wonewoc High School, where he thrived both academically and athletically, engaging in band, FFA, class plays, and chorus. He often humorously remarked that his alternative was returning home to milk cows and clean barns. Although Larry aspired to attend UW-Madison, he received a tuition scholarship to the Wisconsin Institute of Technology in Platteville (Mining School) to pursue a degree in Civil Engineering.

In 1959, Larry married Phyllis James from Binghamton, NY, who took on various jobs while he completed his BS in Civil Engineering. The couple welcomed two children, Anita and Mark, during their time in Platteville. To support his family, Larry made early morning milk deliveries at 4:00 AM before attending classes and worked at a garage in the afternoons. After graduating in 1962, they moved to Sacramento, California, where Larry took on the role of water resources engineer for the California Department of Water Resources. He played a vital role in the California Water Project, a multi-billion-dollar initiative aimed at constructing the Oroville Dam, which captured water in Northern California and transported it to the Central Valley for agricultural irrigation and to Southern California for drinking. During their five years in Sacramento, two more children, Matthew and Morgan, were born.

In 1967, the family moved back to Wisconsin, and Larry joined the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) as an engineer. Over his 30-plus years there, he managed several programs, including Floodplain, Shoreland, and Wetland management, while collaborating with more than 20 federal agencies.

Larry married Jennie (Blazek) in 1988 during the ASFPM Nashville conference, with a wedding celebration later held at the Essen Haus in Madison. Together, they cherished moments with his four children, six grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. The couple resided in Westmorland in Madison for over 48 years, and Larry felt grateful to have Jennie as his partner in their shared commitment to contributing to their city, country, and the world. Throughout the years, they traveled across all states and many countries, forming friendships worldwide. They truly loved Madison, with its lively arts scene and university offerings.

Resident Spotlight - Jenni Lynn Larson

Jennie was born on November 2, 1950, to John and Flo (Clementi) Blazek and grew up in the Greenbush neighborhood, a triangle area off Regent Street in downtown Madison.

She attended Longfellow Elementary School and Madison Central High School, graduating in 1968 as one of the last classes.

Upon graduating from high school, Jennie began working immediately, obtaining a work permit from the state since she was only 17 years old. She dedicated 38 years to the Department of Natural Resources, where she held various positions, including clerical worker, supervisor, and Administrative Assistant in the Secretary's office, until her retirement.

At the DNR, Jennie met Larry Larson, the love of her life and an engineer there. They purchased a home together in 1977 and tied the knot in 1988, undertaking a complete remodel of their house while doing much of the work themselves.

Jennie and Larry shared a passion for travel, exploring numerous countries in Europe and making four trips to Australia to visit friends. Larry was a leader in a national organization focused on reducing flood losses, and Jennie accompanied him to the annual conference, which took place in various locations across the United States, where she made many friends from around the globe.

A bowling enthusiast for many years, Jennie was also an avid supporter of the Badgers, Packers, and Brewers. She devoted a lot of time to caring for her mother, Flo, who lived to be 97. Jennie frequently visited her, taking her on rides, out for lunch, and to see friends and family.

Jennie and Larry have enjoyed meeting new friends at Cardinal View, weekly Euchre Games and Dining with Friends.










Chaplains Corner
